Nandan condenses his vision for the Club into three 'C's: Consolidation with continuity, Communication & Commitment

Nandan Damani conducted his first formal meeting as President of the Rotary Club of Bombay for 2009-2010 in the glittering Crystal Room of the Taj Mahal Hotel on the afternoon of Tuesday, July 7, 2009.

The chandeliered Crystal Room saw a large turnout of District Officers, Rotary dignitaries, visiting Rotarians, members, Rotaryans and guests, including a galaxy of eminent citizens, some of them Honorary members of the Rotary Club of Bombay.

When Ashish Vaid, who relinquished office at the stroke of midnight on June 30, affixed the President's pin on his successor's lapel, the assembled gathering broke out in spontaneous applause at the smooth transition and change of guard.

The chief guest on the occasion, District Governor T.N. Subramanian, popularly known as Raju, pinned a President's badge on Nandan's jacket and set the tone for the day's programme.

After welcoming the gathering, Nandan, in a rare innovation, felic-

tated both the members and the spouses celebrating their birthday during the week. He hoped that this would lead to greater involvement of members' families in the Club's activities.

He then thanked, honoured and felicitated his predecessor, IPP Ashish Vaid, lauding his contributions to the Club. **(Details on Page 3)**

Following the formal installation of Mr. Venugopal Dhoot as an Honorary member **(See Page 3)**, Nandan got down to the task of expounding his vision and throwing some light on his plans for the year.

At the outset, he thanked his fellow members for reposing faith in him and elevating him to the post of President of a prestigious Club like the Rotary Club of Bombay.

"I thank you for giving me this opportunity to lead our Club. I also look forward to learn, to share and to serve with you. It is indeed a privilege to be in a position whereby one can bring a positive change in the lives of many. Your support in my endeavours will be critical to achieve success."

Nandan said his vision for Rotary could be condensed in three 'C's: **Consolidation with continuity; Communication; and Commitment.**

Starting with **Consolidation with continuity**, he said the Committees for the year had been decided upon after discussions with President-Elect Pradeep Saxena and President-Nomi-

nee Paul George and to ensure that all efforts were directed towards long-term goals.

The focus would be on continuing the projects started by IPP Ashish, viz., the Junior College at Talwada, the *Bhavishya-Yaan* project, the Vocational Centre and the Old Age Home, and to take them forward.

"We hope that in future these projects will also become jewels in the Rotary crown, just as the Hasanali Tobaccowala Eye Centre and the Ajit Deshpande Medical Centre at Talwada are our *Kohinoor* projects today."

This is a Club that one comes to, to learn how to serve; it's an institution by itself, says DG Raju

The Rotary Club of Bombay was the recipient of the ultimate encomium at the first meeting of the new Rotary year 2009-2010.

It came when District Governor T.N. Subramanian Raju, who was the chief guest, said that "this is not a Club that one comes to, to tell you how to serve. This is a Club one comes to, to learn how to serve".

"As Governor, I strongly believe that I am just one among 6,100 Rotarians who are humble servants of Rotary, seeking to lend a hand with compassion and with a large heart, to touch the millions who can see no light in their days. When we wear the (Rotary) pin, that's exactly what we do.

"And a shining example of wonderful service is the Rotary Club of Bombay and the multifarious projects that it executes year after year. Whether or not there is a Governor around is irrelevant, because I think this Club is an institution by itself... doing yeoman's service to Rotary."

The DG, who revealed that he was attending his 34th installation meeting of the year, said that this one was far different from all the others because it involved the installation of a very simple and humble, but committed and dedicated man as President of a prestigious Club.

The Club belonged to a rare league – it was one of the top 50 Clubs in the world with the largest membership in Rotary.

Several illustrious leaders had led the Club with distinction, some of whom had gone on to lead the District and also served Rotary International in various capacities.

Some of the names that he recalled were those of Sir Phiroze Sethna, Sir Shapoorjee Billimoria, Mohamed Hasham Premji, Sohrab Vimadala, Dr. Shantilal Mehta, Ambalal Kilachand and Naval Ardeshir.

Thus, the DG said, the Club had a rich tradition of throwing up one outstanding leader after another. In fact, he added, "the leadership and the service that this Club gives to Rotary is something that every Club must look up to and look forward to in order to understand what service means and to wear the (Rotary) pin with pride".

Raju lauded the "wonderful year", 2008-2009, under IPP Ashish Vaid and complimented him and Rotaryann Gopi "for a terrific year".

Continuing his inspiring address, DG Raju said that the road to suc-

cess was long and winding, with many paths to cross.

"Take the one which is the shortest, but always with value, with respect and with ethics as you follow that path. People may follow the path that is the longest but with no mercy and respect.

"Each day is a new beginning. As Rotarians, remember to serve the people who require your service and extend a hand to do so.

"Always respect others. Show mercy and pride in whatever you do. Give all that you can with good deeds and actions and I am sure God will always be on our side, for we serve selflessly with no reward for ourselves but to benefit those whom we seek to serve."

M/s Raju and Jimmy have done it – once again!

A little-known fact came to the fore at the last meeting when District Governor Raju Subramanian was the chief guest.

Raju, a senior advocate by profession, and Jimmy Pochkhana-walla, also a senior advocate and senior member of the Club, had won a famous victory just a day earlier (on July 6) when the Bombay High Court delivered a resounding verdict against the Maharashtra government's plan to restrict admissions to junior colleges.

The government had proposed a 90:10 formula to reserve 90% of seats for students of the SSC Board and 10% for students of all other boards. The court set it aside as unconstitutional.

Among the galaxy of senior counsel who challenged this move as illegal were DG Raju and Jimmy. They offered their services free of charge even though they were engaged for six days.

Jimmy informed *The Gateway* that he and Raju had similarly argued and won in the Supreme Court of India the well-known "Bombay Hawkers Case".

FULSOME PRAISE FOR IPP ASHISH VAID

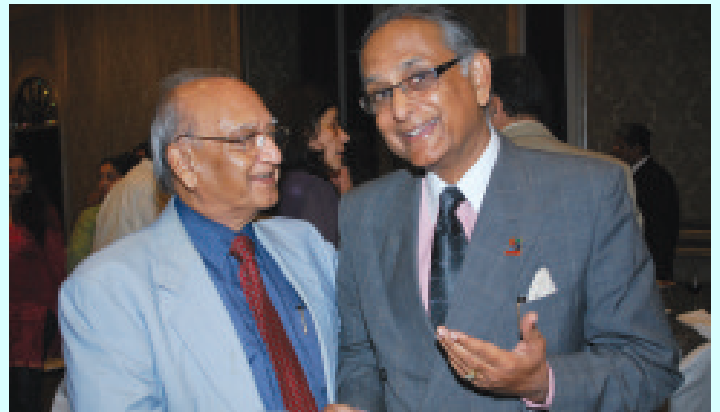

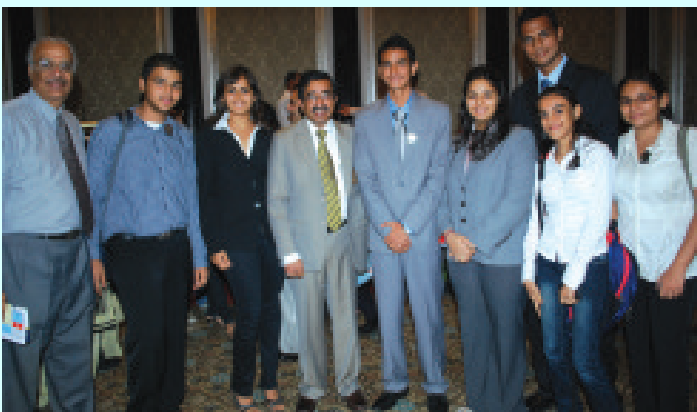

As for **Communication**, Nandan said Rotary without communication was akin to a man winking at a beautiful girl in the dark. He knew what he was doing, but she did not. Communication was the single most important factor that had changed the world in the last decade. It had transformed lives and brought everyone closer.

The Club's web page, too, had been redesigned to suit the needs of the day. He requested all Committee Chairmen, Rotaractors and Interactors to provide information and photographs about the work being done by them so that it could be immediately uploaded on to the website. This would be a source of inspiration and pride to all members.

Besides, since the website could be accessed by all, it would help spread awareness about the Club's activities to the outside world.

"The internet has been carefully chosen as our preferred channel of communication as it is the second fastest method to spread information. The fastest one still remains the same, viz., 'to tell a woman'," Nandan added, tongue firmly in cheek.

Finally, he turned to the third 'C', **Commitment**.

The first commitment was towards Rotary itself, starting with attendance, and every Rotarian was very particular about this. When he was chosen President-Elect, the one question asked of him was, "Who is your Attendance Committee Chairman going to be?" This indicated the seriousness with which members viewed attendance. Now, he looked forward to seeing his fellow Rotarians at all Club programmes.

Nandan requested every member to pledge time, money and effort and to contribute constructively towards the Club and its projects. He also requested every Rotarian to become a Paul Harris Fellow and to contribute to The Rotary Foundation.

Turning to the **District Thrust** areas, the President said that like other Clubs, the Rotary Club of Bombay also had a commitment towards these. The Thrust areas this year were:

(1) Generating awareness and undertaking measures towards better water management and reducing global warming;

(2) Working for inclusion and empowerment of the disabled;

(3) Collaborating with DISHA, a movement aimed at bringing about a meaningful change in the lives of the underprivileged; and

(4) Rotarians' personal commitment to ethics and moral values to be practised in their personal and professional lives.

Nandan urged every Rotarian to adopt one of these Thrust areas and to devote their time and talent towards it.

"Many hands make work light. Together, we can easily dream the impossible dream, right the 'unrightable' wrong and reach the unreachable star. The Rotary Theme for the year is **The Future of Rotary is in Your Hands**. Let us all join hands and work towards a bigger, better and brighter Rotary."

Nandan added that ten members of the Rotary Club of Bombay had been chosen by the District Governor to serve on his team. They were: Past Presidents Arvind Jolly, Rajnikant Reshamwala, Sandip Agarwalla, Kalpana Munshi, Gul Kripalani and Dr. Rumi Jehangir, President-Nominee Paul George, Shailesh Haribhakti, Deepak Kapadia and Sitaram Shah. He congratulated them on their selection.

After naming the Office-Bearers and the Board of Directors, Nandan handed over the proceedings to Hon. Secretary Shivkumar Israni who read out the names of all Committee Chairpersons. Every Office-Bearer, Director and Chairperson was requested to stand and be recognised.

Finally, Nandan presented a cheque for the District Welfare Fund to the District Governor.

DG Raju said that in a service organisation such as Rotary (which included leaders from various walks of life, whether industry, trade or profession), it was best if the leaders (such as the President) welcomed all members with a "soft heart" so that when they worked together they would be able to far exceed their goals.

Leadership in Rotary was neither "I" nor "You", it was always "We" and "Us". Team effort alone could ensure the success of a service organisation such as Rotary because every Rotarian's heart "ticks for service".

"The ladies and gentlemen who form part of our wonderful organisation are people we must respect the most as they follow us in the path of service."

Finally, DG Raju had a bit of advice for President Nandan. He said, "You have a charming smile; keep that

charming smile on for every day of the year that you are President; whatever the trials and tribulations that we face, it is our smile that will get others to smile and allow us to serve beyond ourselves".

Wishing the Club a great year of Fellowship and service, he added that he would always be around to offer support as an ordinary servant of Rotary.

Earlier, District Group Coordinator Anil Chopra introduced Assistant Governor Dr. Quresh Maskati who went on to introduce the District Governor.

The vote of thanks was proposed by President-Elect Pradeep Saxena.
