

Madam Anita Peter advised me to go for a consultation at Tata Memorial hospital and gave me a reference letter.


I visited Tata Memorial hospital, where they conducted a biopsy and confirmed the cancer.


"It is a proud moment for me personally and the Godrej Group, because I believe that our business and social impact has grown on the basis of the hard work and dedication of all the Godrej employees, customers, and the larger Godrej family." He also reminisced about his interactions with the late Pravinchandra Varjivan Gandhi, whom he had the pleasure of knowing as a banker when he was Chairman and Managing Director of Dena Bank.

"Mr. Gandhi has had a long and fruitful association with

associations such as IMC and FICCI, to name a few. He has been an inspiration to all of us through his healthy contributions to the economy and public life," said Mr. Adi Godrej in acknowledging the award he had received in memory of the latter.


He then went on to speak about the subject that everyone was eager to get his perspective on - the Indian economy. "I've been part of the consumer goods industry in India for nearly five decades now, and have seen the transformation in [our] economy from being control-based to now being more liberated." The shift in economy, according to him, has been enabled by a number of structural and policy changes, especially over the last few years. "I would like to spend the next few minutes sharing my observations with you," he stated.

Mr. Adi Godrej believes India remains a global bright spot with a rapidly growing major economy, with GDP growth estimated to be 7.3% (for financial year 2018). While he admits that our internal









assessment, as advance evaluations show, is lower, he still feels we will beat the 6.5% estimate. In the same vein, he perceives the muted growth to be a result of the "uncertainty around possible financial stress, increased protectionism, and rising geopolitical tensions," especially in light of the current US administration's stances on policy and its global ramifications.

Nevertheless, India has been able to mitigate some of the negative consequences of the global financial turmoil, partly on the basis of the nation's large consumer market; The Consumer Confidence Index stands at 128 (for quarter two of 2017), which is the second highest position in the Asia Pacific region. Hence, India remains one of the most optimistic markets of the region and even globally.

This consistent confidence among consumers has resulted in some positive outcomes. For example, urban consumption, especially in middle and high income groups, has seen a sharp increase. India's young population, a much touted inclufencer of growth, also provides constructive, forward-looking growth potential. Thus, we can expect further urbanisation, greater awareness, and an improvement in communication structures that will only additionally drive economic expansion in our country.

Over the last year, the government has covered more ground in the development of our digital economy. "Demonetisation has led to a significant push towards digital financial transactions, as well as improving the tax net," the speaker points out, which made it clear that he remains one of the optimists who believe that the passage of the Goods and Services Tax Bill is a significant achievement, and that its implementation will have a positive impact on the economy.

"In my view, to have a single national value added tax is one of the key reforms since the liberalisation in 1991." This, he feels, is specifically because the government has taken big steps towards bringing FMCG products



below the 18% GST tax rate slab, which is lower than what taxes used to be earlier. This will be a crucial driver of growth and consumption in the coming years.

Towards the end, the awardee suggests a few more areas where our government can make amends, in order to enable the Indian economy to reach double digit growth figures, including: supporting policy changes such as relaxation of FDI limits in single brand retail, as well as improving ease of business through easier online applications, delicensing, and speedier approvals. "In my opinion, on a Purchasing Power Parity (PPP), India should be able to become the largest economy globally by 2050," concluded Mr. Adi Godrej.

# One more feather in Bhavishya Yaan's Cap - STEM started at NMJ



enth of January 2018 became an important day in the calendar of NMJ Municipal School.

Let me first turn the clock back.

Sometime in October, 2017, our President Ramesh Narayan came up with the idea of BY working with Indian School of Management & Entrepreneurship (ISME). The Founding Dean and Chairperson Dr. Indu Shahani, ISME wholeheartedly welcomed the idea.

After this, I met with Ms.Sonali Agnihotri, Director, Enterprise & Outreach and Ms.Arwa Baldiwala, Director, Academics & Director, Social Responsibilities & Enactus, both from ISME. I gave them a detailed outline of Bhavishya Yaan (BY).

After some good brainstorming sessions, all of us came up with the idea of STEM - science, technology, engineering and mathematics. I felt that it is important to introduce the BY children to this important concept, especially in today's rapidly changing world. Schools, colleges and universities all over the world and leading companies too are giving a lot of emphasis to STEM.

STEM is increasingly finding a lot of traction in today's rapidly changing world what with Artificial Intelligence (AI), Internet of Things (IoT), self driven cars etc., being the topics for the future.

It was then decided by us that ISME students under the supervision of Arwa would work with BY 6th, 7th and 8th standard students in NMJ and introduce them to STEM. These classes were deliberately chosen so that the BY children get an early exposure to this important learning area thereby opening their minds, encouraging them to think out of the box.

Whilst BY has over the last so many years focused on equipping the children in the five Municipal Schools with English, computer skills and life skills, the ISME led STEM initiative is an important additional skill to the children when they step out of their school and face the outside world.

Students from ISME would be doing 8 two hourly sessions once a week from the beginning of January till end of February.

On the face of it, STEM as a concept may sound daunting. However, the ISME students worked on ensuring that it would be easy and at the same time an exciting learning opportunity for the NMJ Students.

On the 10th of January, after putting in a lot of preparation, thirteen students of ISME alongwith Arwa came to NMJ Municipal School to begin the once a week interactive sessions.

The first session commenced with introducing technology and engineering through two activities. The instant camaraderie and "connect" between the BY students and ISME students was noteworthy and paved the way for a good, successful beginning, auguring well for the subsequent sessions. This was all the more commendable, given the very different backgrounds they were coming from.

### **LED & Battery**

The BY students were divided into groups, with each group given LED Bulbs and a battery cell. The moment they would connect the two ends of the bulb extensions to the battery cell, the light would come on.

The sole reason of this experiment was to make them aware of the "+" and "-" aspects of a battery. The ISME students informed the BY children that the inventor of the bulb worked pretty much on the same lines. The children were then asked to correlate this to their remote control battery cells which too have positive and negative signs.

The key takeaway was to make them aware about how batteries function, information about something we use daily and don't really know how it works.

### **Paper Tower**

The next activity was to make them think out of the box. This is in line with what the world demands out of the ambitious new generation.





Each group was asked to build a Tower using only four things - paper, tapes, hands and creativity. They were encouraged to be the builders of their structures in which they had to display creativity and balance, with something as light as paper which was the steel and cement of their Towers for the day.

Going beyond our expectations, they ended up emulating skyscrapers like Burj Khalifa in Dubai and some used the LED bulbs to light up their Towers!

The key takeaways were to introduce them to team work, creativity and experiencing collaboration amidst individualistic ideas, apart from encouraging them to think out of the box.

It was all in all a great experience for the BY children and the team from ISME. Both of them very much look forward to the forthcoming sessions.
