and the Government of Maharashtra. The other project is with WOTR Foundation where safe drinking water will be provided to villages in Marathwada and Jalna districts. The total expense outlay on these water projects is expected to be ₹10 crores.

We will also dedicate our efforts towards better health care and have planned several medical camps and facilities towards this purpose.

We have planned various initiatives to renovate and improve

the facilities at Masina Hospital and provide medical aid to the underprivileged. Noor Hospital has also agreed to provide certain medical services free of cost.

On the environment front, President Ramesh has already

initiated attaining the platinum LED certification which will be spread over 2 years. We also plan to illuminate the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalaya.

As a continuing project we will be taking measures towards looking at the restoration of the Durbar Hall at the Asiatic Library and towards digitization of books.

Besides this, we have many exciting fund raising and public image activities in the pipeline, the proceeds of which will be directed to our several initiatives as well as continuing the laudable work on the ongoing projects.

I believe each one of us have our unique gifts to offer and can empower others within as well as outside our Club. It is heartening to see that each Committee has prepared a blueprint of the work we plan to execute this year. We have selected a set of high value activities as a part of this plan.

About Rtn. Gulam A. Vahanvaty

He is an alumnus of two of Mumbai's finest Educational Institutions, St. Mary's High School, Byculla and St. Xaviers College, Fort.

He was selected for a Post Graduate Diploma in Management by I.I.M. Kolkata on the basis of a very competitive examination and upon graduation in 1970, was invited to join the Tata Administrative Service (T.A.S.) which in its heydays, was the Finest Administrative Service in India, where only the best and the brightest were selected and groomed for High Office.

Unfortunately, due to his Father's indifferent health, Gulam had to leave T.A.S. in 1974 and take over the reins of the Family Business of Scrap Processing and Ship Breaking.

Gulam's initial "Eureka" Moment in Rotary happened in 1978 when he was selected as a Member of the District 3141 Group Study Exchange (GSE) Team bound for Rotary District 656 in Indiana, U.S.A. To this day he carries fond memories of the families that hosted him.

In December 1979 he was invited to join the Rotary Club of Bombay Downtown, and in 1985 - 86 was elected to serve as President.

In 2002 - 03 District 3140 elected him as District Governor.

As District Governor, he united the District Leaders and Presidents of disparate Rotary Clubs, big, small, committed, hesitant by a motivating message "Working Together Works," and Working Together, did Work. It resulted in a record contribution to TRF in District 3140 of US\$ 654,000, the largest contribution by any Rotary District in India till 2006 - 2007.

There was, however, an equally big game-changer.... the Jan Seva Abhiyan or Railway Station Adoption Project. Rotary Clubs across the District adopted Railway Stations and made it their mission to ease the hassles associated with local rail commuting. Most leaders would baulk at attempting an exercise of this magnitude but it was an unqualified success which resulted in very positive PR for Rotary.

In acknowledgement of his Motivational and Training Skills and his record collection for TRF he has been, among other International appointments, Training Leader (twice), Rotary Regional Foundation Coordinator, Chairman of RI's Communications Committee, Chairman of TRF's Alumni Advisory Committee, Member of the critically important TRF Future Vision Committee and member of TRF Peace Centers Committee.

A Major Donor, he is a recipient of RI's Service Above Self Award and TRF's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Award.

His Motto of Service encompasses other initiatives. He is a Member of the Governing Board of Mumbai First, a high-powered group of citizens committed to improve the quality of life in Mumbai, Trustee of the Mohalla Committee Movement Trust and Public Concern for Governance Trust, both spearheaded by Mumbai's Former Police Commissioner Julio Ribeiro that works for probity in public life, promoting the use of RTI and promoting Communal Harmony.

A proficient rider from childhood, horses have always been a passion. He is currently a Committee Member and Steward of the Royal Western India Turf Club Ltd.

Haseena, his spouse and the love of his life passed into the ages on New Year's Day in 2015. Everybody who knew her also knew that Gulam was blessed to have such a life partner.

Son, Zameer, a partner in the family business, which now encompasses diversified ventures, daughter-in-law, Khatija, grand daughter Sumehra, son-In-law Satpal Brainch, daughter Zahabia and their sons Rishaan and Jaiyaan, are a testament of the inclusiveness and understanding of this remarkable individual.

He has served on the RI Membership Committee & was in charge of the Regional Membership plan for Zones 4, 5 & 6A for 2015-17.

He has been RI President's Representative at District conferences in India, Nepal, Pakistan & Philippines 7 times. He was invited by Dist. 5170 (Silicon Valley) in October 2010 to tour the District for 15 days and address clubs of District 5170 on The Rotary Foundation.

Bharat & Madhavi are committed to The Rotary Foundation and are Level II Major Donors. He has been conferred Citation of Meritorious Service and the Distinguished Service Award by The Rotary Foundation. He has been conferred Rotary's highest award "Service Above Self".

Message from RI Director Elect - Rtn. Kamal Sanghvi

Dear Friends,

Let's ask ourselves a question: Do we think everything in our life is perfect just as it is? Or are there some changes we would make if we had the chance? If the answer is "yes"... then you have everything you need to be a Rotarian.

Let me explain. A lot of people choose to sail steadily through life on an even keel. But there are some people who are boat rockers.

They go through life making a fuss when things aren't right, and fighting the fights for us that we don't always fight for ourselves. Well, those boat rockers are who we call "Rotarians" – Why? Because we have seen things going on in our lives, or in the world, that we think could be better. And rather than just accepting things as they are, we have done something about it. We have become active.

From the time we're old enough to talk, everyone of us has what it takes to be a Rotarian. We have a voice and an opinion. What are we doing? We are protesting. We're standing up for something. And here's where it gets really interesting. Many of the biggest changes that have ever happened in history have happened because We Rotarians decided to stand up and speak out about something.

Let me give you some examples of people who brought about change. Think of Dr. Martin Luther King and Mahatma Gandhi, and the great lessons they taught the world.

They showed us that there was a better way to fight for a cause. They showed us that non-violence can win your fight. It was a very, very significant change in the way of the world.

Dr. King told us that: "Sooner or later all the people of the world will have to discover a way to live together in peace...." His lesson was powerful enough to bring real change to civil rights in America, just as Mahatma Gandhi showed his people that non-violent protests could win them independence.

Or think of Mother Teresa who single-handedly worked to alleviate leprosy. If a single person could do this, then what can four people accomplish?

If there was a group of four people with an idea, who could focus their energy, what could they do? Well, they could do something, like, say, set up an organization of fellowship and brotherhood.

That's what four men once did, not so long ago. Their idea grew into something that is now called Rotary International. Which I feel has inspired me to do more, physically and spiritually, that is why I do more.

How often do you hear someone say: "Give up," "Why bother...," and "Nothing you can say or do will ever help..." Well, here's a tip: Don't believe them. They're wrong.



They will never make a difference in this World because they have chosen not to try.

There are Rotarians out there committed to pushing along change. They are out there, everywhere and it is very easy be one of them! The difference between those who are successful, and those who are not, is how they focus their energy.

We Rotarians want our life to count for something, that's why we start thinking about what you can do to make this World a better place to live in.

We Rotarians have promised the World: by the time we're done, they will be truly amazed at what we have achieved. And that is why I am a Rotarian!

ooni Taraporevala is an Indian screenwriter, photographer and filmmaker who is best known as the screenwriter of Mississippi Masala, The Namesake and Oscar-nominated Salaam Bombay (1988), all directed by Mira Nair.

Born to a Parsi family. Sooni completed her schooling from Queen Mary school, Bombay.

In 2000, she self-published PARSIS The Zoroastrians of India 1980-2004 which is a traditionally closed off



community since their persecution in Persia, the first and only visual documentation of the Parsi community. A runaway success, the second edition was published in partnership with Overlook Press, NY, in 2004 and is still in print.

She was awarded the Padma Shri by Government of India in 2014. She is a member of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts & Sciences. Her photographs are in the permanent collections of the National Gallery of Modern Art, Delhi & the Metropolitan Museum of Art, NY.

Sooni will be taking us through the history of Bombay in an interesting format titled Bombay v/s Mumbai.
